C. Participation - who comes to meetings and is engaged?



## Skills that can be shared at the troop or community level

- A. Job skills EMT/Nurse/Doctor, professional photographer, forestry/game management, teachers
- B. Hobby skills scrapbooking, jewelry making, crafting, painting, gardening
- C. Utilizing those skills for badge work camping, photography, genealogy, first aid

How do we get our parents or caregivers to participate?



#### 10 strategies for recruiting active volunteers

- 1. Start with a plan.
- 2. Be clear about the time commitment.
- 3. Ask for a small commitment first.
- 4. Match their skills with assignments.
- 5. Remove potential barriers to participation.
- 6. Make them feel appreciated.
- 7. Offer an orientation.
- 8. Share stories of other volunteers.
- 9. Highlight the positive
- 10. Communicate what's in it for them.
